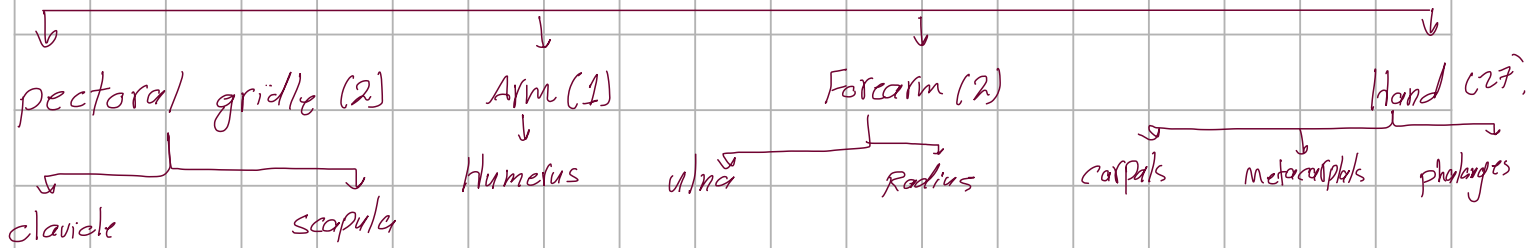

Humerus 1



* Head of the humerus articulates with the glenoid cavity of the scapula

* Lateral angle of scapula presents the glenoid cavity for articulation with the head of the humerus.

* The surgical neck is the most common site of humerus fracture.

* The medial epicondyle is more prominent.

* The depression on the posterior side of the humerus for the ulna when the elbow is extended is the olecranon fossa.

* The structure that travels through the intertubercular groove is the tendon of the long head of the biceps muscles.

* The epicondyle of the humerus that's described as being more prominent is Medial epicondyle.

* The bone that is located on the medial side of the forearm is Radius.

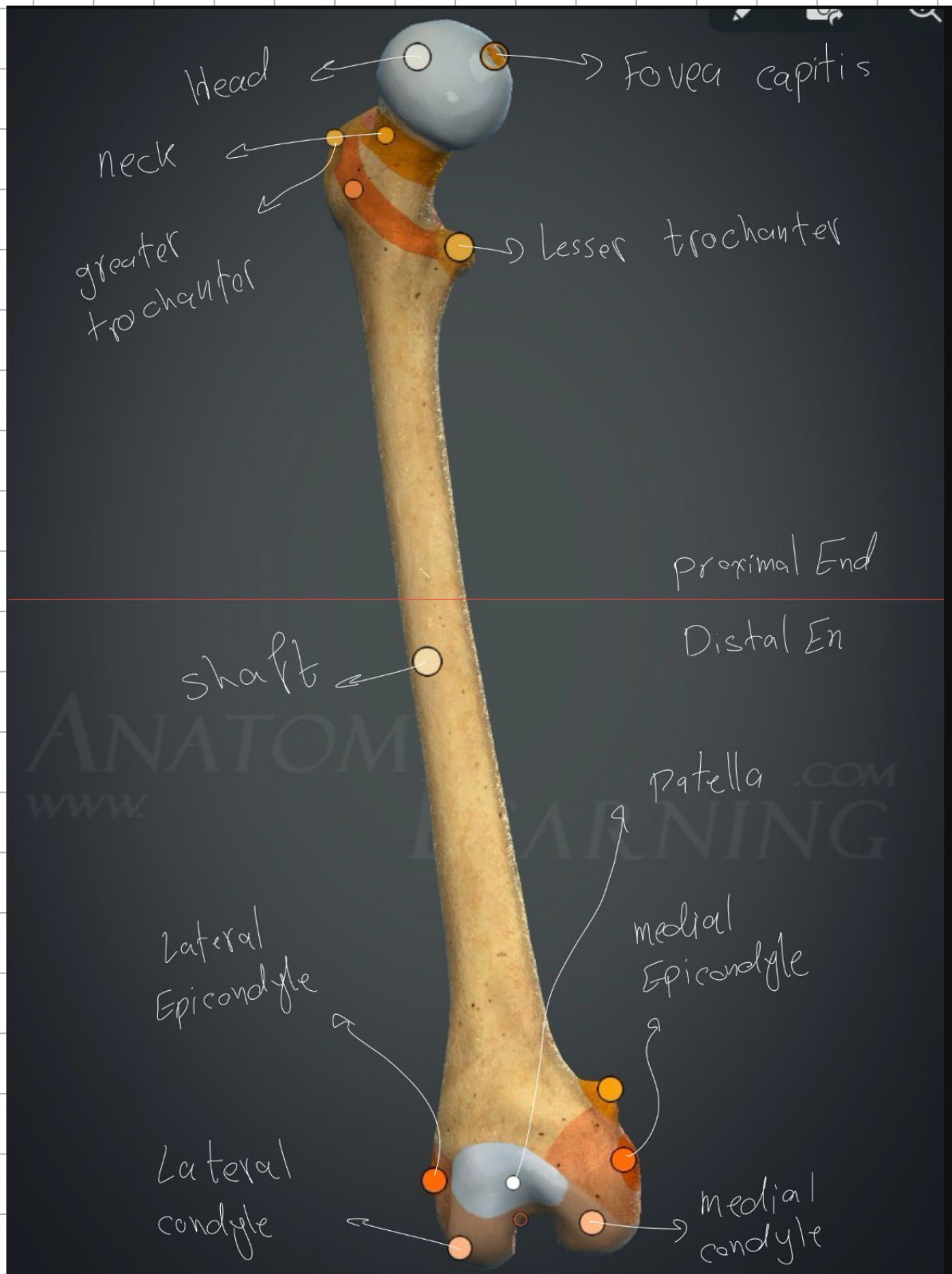
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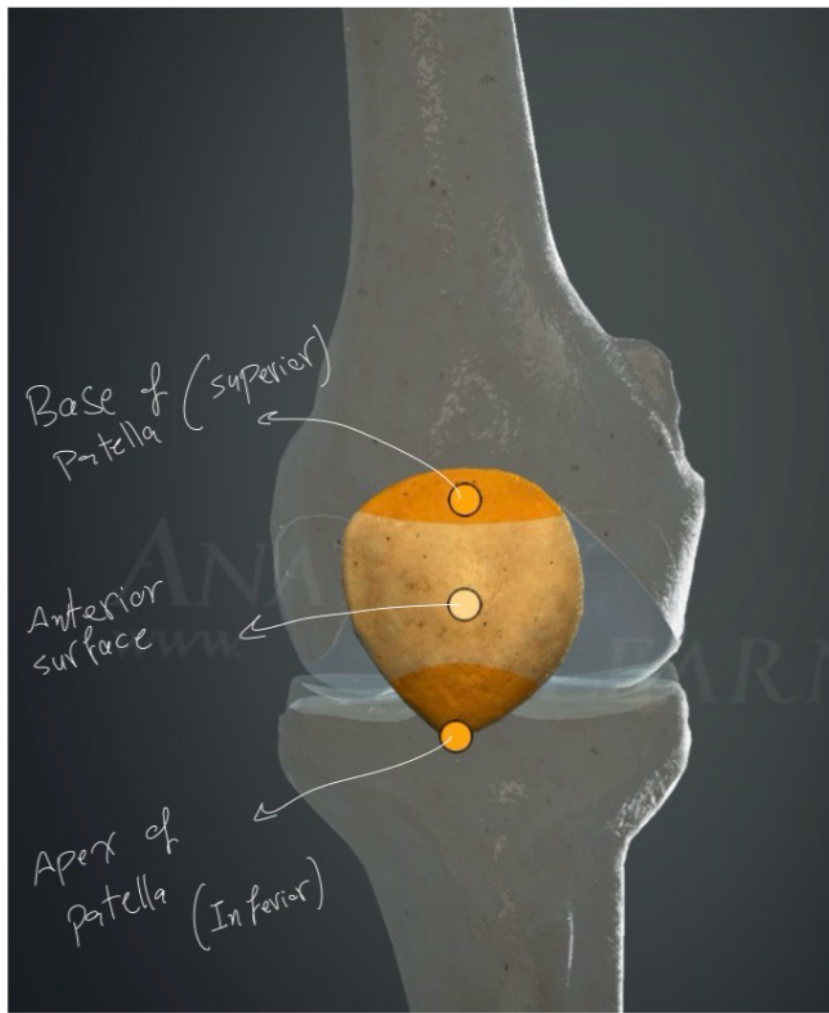

Position	• Medial	• Lateral
Proximal end	• Ulnar notch • Olecranon process • <u>Coronoid process</u> (البرقعة) • Articulates with trochlea	• Disc-shaped head • Articulates with capitulum
Shaft	• <u>Triangular</u>	• Triangular • <u>Radial</u> tuberosity for tendon of biceps
Interosseous border	• Lateral	• Medial
Distal end	• Head of ulna • Posteriorly located Styloid process	• <u>Laterally</u> located Styloid process
Wrist joint	• Not involved	• Involved

Feature	The Ilium	The Pubis	The Ischium
Position	Largest and most superior.	Inferior and anterior part.	Inferior and posterior part.
Main Features	- Iliac crest (Superior border). - Four iliac spines (Superior/Inferior & Anterior/Posterior). - Greater sciatic notch.	- Pubic symphysis (where two pubic bones meet). - Pubic arch.	- Ischial tuberosity (part you sit on). - Ischial spine. - Lesser sciatic notch.
